HIGH LEVEL SANITATION SUMMIT | 11 DECEMBER 2023, ROOM MH4

Achieving universal WASH coverage by 2030 will require a substantial increase in global rates of progress: sixfold for drinking water, fivefold for sanitation, and threefold for hygiene. With rates of progress varying greatly been countries, in some of the most underserved, the increase required will be even more dramatic. Of particular concern are the metrics related to SDG 6.2: in 2022 still 3.5 billion people lacked access to safely managed sanitation, including 1.5 billion lacking even basic sanitation services. These metrics send a resounding message that current policies and practices are falling short, and that immediate action is imperative.

This Summit will bring together high-level policymakers from across the African region, responsible for shaping and implementing sanitation policies, as well as representatives from development institutions, UN agencies, regulators, and service providers. Together, they will share experiences, debate common challenges and opportunities, and engage in discussions to strategise the acceleration of progress towards SDG 6.2, with a particular focus on the African context.

Objectives

- Review the status of sanitation policies on the African continent, and the opportunities for and impediments to related actions;
- Exchange experiences in implementing action for the achievement of the SDG 6 sanitation target (target 6.2) and the opportunities offered by the agreed acceleration framework;
- Explore options for the strengthened role of regulators, applying the criteria contained in existing and newly formulated legislation and collaborating constructively with the managers of programmes and enterprises for sanitation services delivery.

Expected outcome

Raising awareness among the audience regarding the importance of granting sanitation a prominent place in political and policy arenas, enhancing support for LAMIC in embracing innovative and inclusive sanitation practices and identifying options to strengthen the financial framework supporting sustainable sanitation actions; obtaining a concrete result in the form of a commitment from utilities and regulators to collaborate on achieving inclusive sanitation.

13:30 - 15:00 | Financing SDG 6.2: Accelerating Inclusive Sanitation in low- and middle-income countries

The objective of this session is to explore and discuss the financial dimensions of promoting the enabling environment for inclusive sanitation at different levels, of establishing a systems approach to sanitation, of overcoming institutional challenges and fragmentation, of enhancing monitoring and data management, and of strengthening capacity development and innovation.

15:30 - 17:00 | Regulation for Inclusive Sanitation

The objective of this session is to promote a dialogue between sanitation regulators and sanitation practitioners (managers of public and private sanitation service providers) which will lead to productive models of collaboration, recognising each other's roles and responsibilities in the creation of an enabling legal, institutional and regulatory framework for sustainable and inclusive sanitation service delivery.
